**Trail Signs**

**STOP**  
Purpose: Used to halt users on a snowmobile trail or road crossings and major trail intersections.

**Warning**  
Purpose: A warning sign. When snowmobiles are on a trail, users will have the word CORRIDOR together with its assigned trail number.

**2**  
Purpose: To inform the user that he or she is on a designated CORRIDOR trail (a snowmobile trail between two points of pressure, or through trails). These signs will have the word CORRIDOR together with its assigned trail number.

**51B**  
Purpose: To inform the user that he or she is on a designated SECONDARY trail (to connect trail between two points of pressure, or through trails). These signs will have the word SECONDARY together with its assigned trail number.

**YIELD**  
Purpose: The YIELD sign warns users that a trail intersection is approaching and they have the right of way. The YIELD sign is used at trail intersections where speed and visibility allow the safe yielding of vehicles without the necessity of a stop.

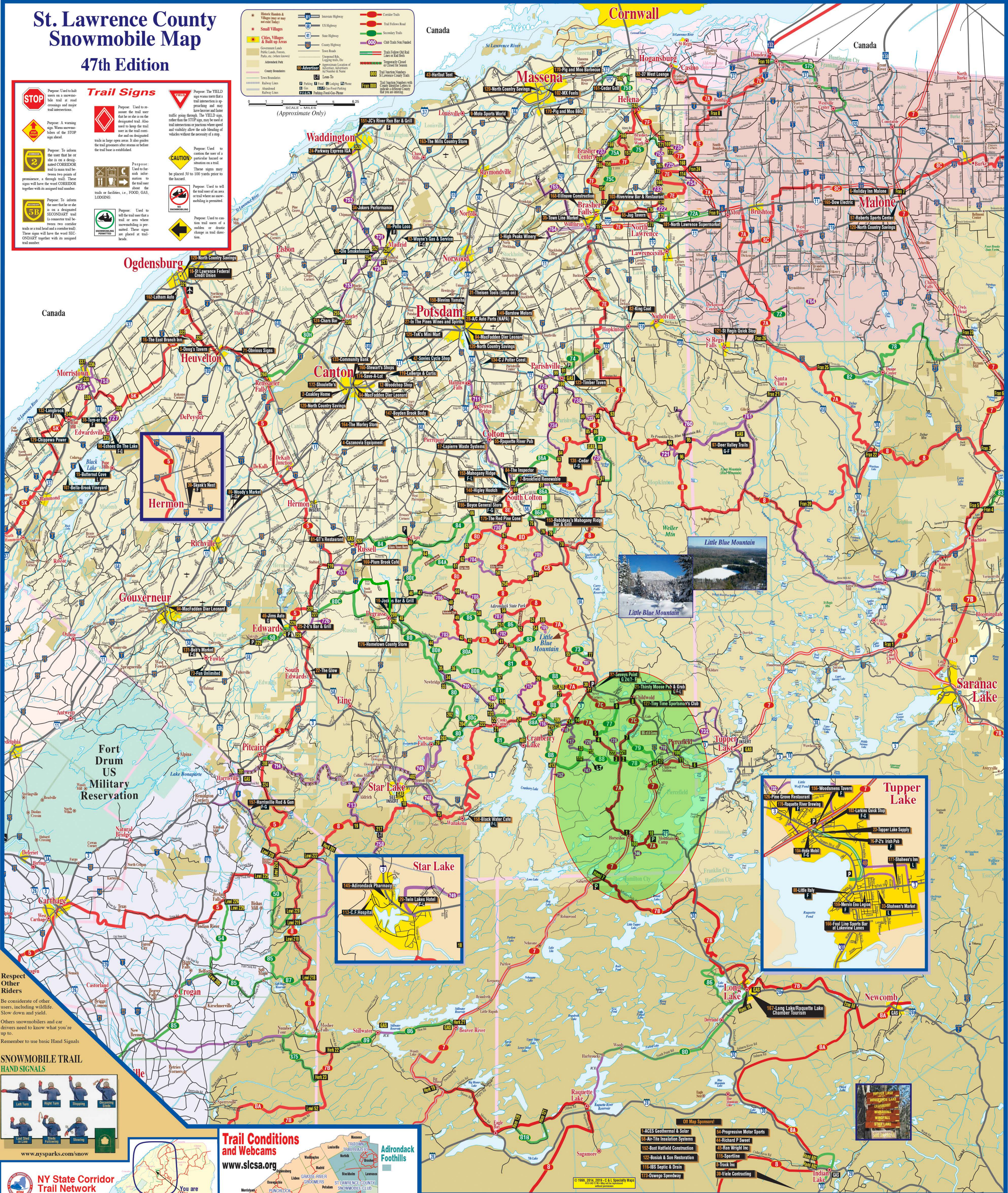
**CAUTION**  
Purpose: Used to caution the user of a particular hazard or condition on a trail. These signs may be placed 50 to 100 yards prior to the hazard.

**Trailhead**  
Purpose: Used to tell the user of an access or trail where snowmobiling is permitted.

**Trail Direction**  
Purpose: Used to caution the user of a sudden or drastic change in trail direction.

**Trailhead**  
Purpose: Used to caution the user of a trail or area where snowmobiling is prohibited or restricted.
